

The Trust manages a network of 100 schools where 23,200 children, most of them girls and almost 3,000 orphans study. FEED, in partnership with GBKCT run the 120-acre Hyderabad Institute of Excellence (HIE) which sends hundreds of students to premier institutes in the country for excellence and specialisation.

Most of our charity projects are strategically positioned around education and educational upliftment of the masses. We firmly believe that an enlightened and empowered society and a future of prosperity can only sprout from the seeds of education.









BENCHES PROJECT




